

2018 GLOBAL YOUTH MURALS PROJECT GUIDELINES

Murals are accepted throughout the year. Please submit your murals at any time.



WHO MAY PARTICIPATE

Students ages 4-19 years old, from Primary through Secondary grade level.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF SUBMISSIONS

A class/group may submit a maximum of three murals per year.

CATEGORIES

Typically, primary students are ages 4-10 years old, middle-school students are ages 10-13, and secondary students are ages 14-19. Participants may select the category that describes their age group.

AWARDS & RECOGNITION

Six murals will be selected to receive awards according to the three categories: primary, middle, and secondary school. These murals will be featured in a 2019 PTPI publication and included in an online art gallery. Winning schools/groups will be notified about awards no later than December 2018, and all participating groups will receive a certificate of appreciation as their murals are received. EXHIBITS

Murals from various years will be displayed in galleries within the Greater Kansas City area of Missouri and Kansas USA. Select murals will also travel to PTPI Chapters around the world for exhibits through our *Global Youth Murals on Tour* project.

DEADLINE

We encourage classes to submit their murals as they finish them. They may be submitted anytime during the year. To be considered for a 2018 award, murals should arrive at PTPI World Headquarters by **October 31**. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

People to People International (PTPI), an organization dedicated to understanding and friendship among people of different countries, believes art is a universal language. Each year, we invite students worldwide to create Global Youth Murals, artwork that illustrates their cultures and communities and/or their ideas about global issues and peace. This year's theme is *One People, One World*.

Since our founding by U.S. President Dwight Eisenhower in 1956, People to People International has worked to connect people around the world. Through these connections, we hope to dispel misunderstandings, reconcile our past differences and foster peace and cooperation. Understanding is the key to lasting peace within friendships, families, communities, and cultures.

In your mural, share with us the ways you think individuals and groups connected to each other and around the world. What are common themes that connect people around the world? What do we all share? What do we all want for our families?

Creating Your Mural

DIMENSIONS AND MATERIALS

- Use white or brown paper or light-weight canvas (please do not use cardboard) measuring 20 inches wide and 60 inches long or 51 centimeters wide and 152 centimeters long. It is fine to attach two or three pieces to meet measurement requirements.
- Murals will be hung vertically, so please design accordingly.
- Students may use crayons (press hard for rich color), oil pastels, markers, paints and ink, or collage elements such as photographs. Please be sure that all collage elements are firmly glued in place. Please do not use charcoal. Laminated murals are accepted and will likely be exhibited through our *Global Youth Murals on Tour*, due to durability.
- Fill entire paper surface with color.
- Students may include text in their artwork. When possible, please include English translations of text.
- Teachers please photograph artwork in progress (optional).

Mailing Your Mural

BIOGRAPHY FORM

A Biography Form must accompany each mural. Please provide complete information.

PARENTAL PERMISSION FORMS

A Parental Permission Form should be given to the parents or guardians of each student who works on a mural. The signed forms allow People to People International to use images of the students or their artwork in the organization's promotional materials or on its website. Please feel free to translate the form into other languages.

MAILING DETAILS

We suggest the use of sturdy mailing tubes or boxes to avoid damage to murals. **The following items should be included:**

- Mural(s)
- Completed Biography Form(s)
- Signed Parental Permission Form for each student
- Photographs of artwork in progress. *Photographs are optional and appreciated. Photographs also may be emailed to kristiejeanes@ptpi.org.*
